Dear sports enthusiasts,

it is a particular pleasure for us to welcome you on the occasion of a remarkable anniversary: MTK Bad Harzburg is celebrating its 140th anniversary this year. Congratulations! And for over half a century, the club has shaped orienteering in Germany, combining sporting passion.



To mark this special occasion, MTK Bad Harzburg is hosting the German Orienteering Championships over the sprint distance. In doing so, the club is once again setting new standards in organisation and sporting enthusiasm. The event marks the grand finale of a trilogy: 2024 in Liebenburg-Döhren, 2025 in Clausthal-Zellerfeld and now 2026 in Bad Harzburg, Osterwieck and Hornburg. Organising such a championship requires enormous effort – all the more reason for us to thank all club members and volunteers who make this possible.

Particularly noteworthy is the K.O. Sprint, which is making its debut in Germany and will be held for the first time at the historic state stud farm in Bad Harzburg. Around 600 participants of all ages are expected, including top international athletes.

These championships impressively demonstrate how sport brings people together across regional boundaries. The collaboration between clubs from Lower Saxony and Saxony-Anhalt makes the event a living example of cross-border partnership: sport, enthusiasm and team spirit know no national borders.

Orienteering is a fascinating sport: using a map and compass, participants search for control points in the shortest possible time. In the sprint formats, spectators experience the action up close – right in the heart of the town and historic old towns. MTK Bad Harzburg is one of the oldest orienteering clubs in Germany and played a key role in popularising the sport as early as the 1960s. Major events such as the 2012 World Masters Championships demonstrate the club's experience and professionalism.

We are delighted that these championships are providing impetus not only in sporting terms but also socially: permanent control point networks for the public and the integration of the sport into school curricula bring orienteering to life and inspire enthusiasm among children and young people.

Our thanks go to all the organisers and helpers who are making this event possible. They are helping to raise the profile of orienteering, bring people together and spark enthusiasm for sport and exercise – across club and state borders in our two beautiful states, together in Lower Saxony and Saxony-Anhalt. Especially in these times, when we sometimes talk more about what divides us than what unites us, this is a very important signal of togetherness and proof of how we, as a society, stick together.

We wish all participants exciting competitions, fair races and unforgettable moments in Bad Harzburg, Osterwieck and Hornburg. May the anniversary of MTK Bad Harzburg be a resounding success – both in sporting and human terms.

Orienteering is a global sport. Since the first orienteering and ski orienteering events took place in Norway at the end of the 19th century

Although it has been documented and has been a permanent fixture of the World Games programme as an officially recognised Olympic sport since 2001, the appeal of this unique sport remains undiminished: the balance between running at speed and concentrating on the navigation task. What is fascinating is that the more than one million active participants in over 70 national federations must make split-second decisions on the optimal route during the race, despite the physical exertion.

Even though the sport is not yet a national pastime in Germany, unlike in Scandinavia, one thing unites everyone:

Orienteering connects people with nature. In doing so, they learn to navigate within it, to interact with it, and to appreciate it. I am proud that the Harz region, spanning three districts, is hosting the German Championships.

Late entries:

Only possible subject to availability until Wednesday, 20 May 2026. Late registration fees: €10 for individual starts (€5 for D/H-12b), €10 per relay (D/H-12 T and Open €5). Late registration for the direct heats on Saturday and Sunday can also be made on the day.

Eligibility:

The AGO competition regulations for orienteering in the version published for 2026 (see in particular categories, minimum age and entry fees), the DTB orienteering regulations and the DTB gymnastics regulations apply. A DTB ID and a valid annual licence are required for classification in a championship class.

Open start times:

The DirKS and DirKL categories (Saturday from 1.00 pm) and D/H12b (Saturday from 2.10 pm) have free start times. Participants in these categories should collect a sticker from the organisers' office showing their preferred available start time, stick it onto their race number and present it at the pre-start. The start times for the open start slots on Sunday will be announced when the start list is published on Saturday evening.

Changes and late entries:

The named entry for the German Sprint Relay Championships can be changed on Sunday until 8.00 pm – exclusively online via OManager. In justified exceptional cases (e.g. sudden illness), late registrations may be made on Monday until 9.15 am using a form available from the organising office, subject to the late registration fees set out in Appendix 6 of the competition regulations (20 euros for the Championship class, 12 euros for D/H-12T, 15 euros for Open).

Protests:

In accordance with Competition Regulations A 3.2, protests must be lodged with the Competition Management via the Organising Office within 30 minutes of the finish, subject to a fee of 10 euros. If the Organising Office is unstaffed, please contact the Competition Director, Eike Bruns, on 0171/4944142 or his deputy, Pia Buchholz, on 0176/52973150.

Pre-start:

The pre-start for the qualification and the final is four minutes. At -4 minutes, the roll call, clearing and checking take place; at -3 minutes, the loose control descriptions are collected and prepared; at -2 minutes, the SIAC check is carried out; and at -1 minute, competitors line up behind the map box.



Start numbers:

For the DM Sprint and DM K.O. Sprint races, one race number will be issued per person, which must be worn during each of these races. Race numbers will also be issued for the DM Sprint Relay. Race numbers must be worn clearly visible on the chest and the advertising must not be folded away.

Control system:

SPORTident Air+. All generations of conventional SI chips are also accepted. SI chips can be hired for a fee of €5 (€25 deposit).

Finish timing:

A SportIdent BS11-LA station with a ground loop (a so-called finish loop) will be used at the finish line for all races. **This means that the finish stamp is automatically registered on the SIAC when crossing the finish line.** A conventional stamping station will be provided at the finish line for runners with older chips. The finish station does not need to be used when using an SIAC.

Awards:

AGO medals will be awarded to the top three in each championship category, along with certificates and prizes. At the German Sprint Championships and German K.O. Sprint Championships, the top six in each championship category will be honoured. Certificates and prizes will be awarded to the top six in each Bestenkampf category and to all D/H-12b competitors.

Thomas Meier Memorial Cup (challenge cup) for the winner of the Women's Elite and the winner of the Men's Elite at the DM K.O. Sprint.

In the DM Sprint Relay, the top three in a championship category and a best-of-three category will be honoured.



Medical care:

First aid is provided by the German Red Cross (DRK) in the finish area. The nearest emergency hospitals are in Goslar, Halberstadt and Wolfenbüttel.

Insurance:

The organiser, event hosts, landowner and authorities accept no liability beyond that covered by existing insurance policies. It is the responsibility of participants to ensure they have adequate insurance cover.

Data protection:

By registering, each participant consents to the publication of their registration details, results and any photographs in the media, in the start and results lists, and on the internet.

Agreements:

By registering, each participant agrees to behave in accordance with the Orienteering Code of Conduct and to respect Safe OSport.

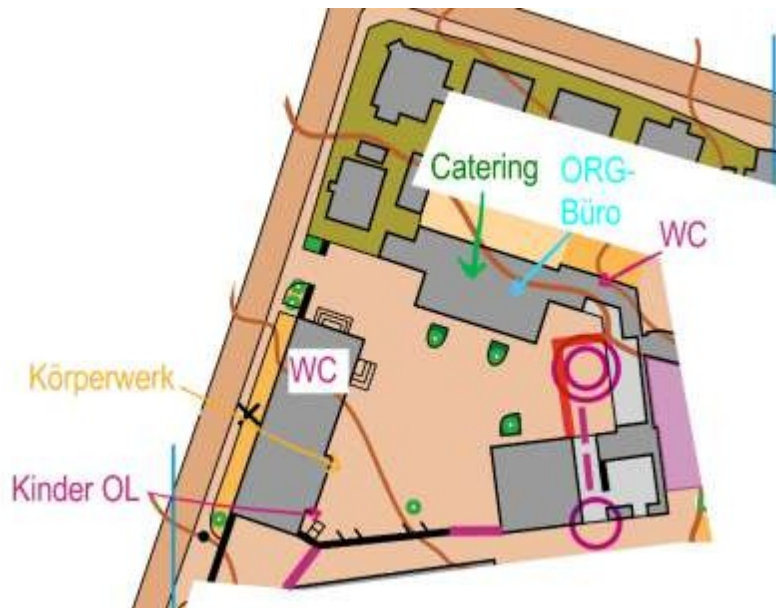

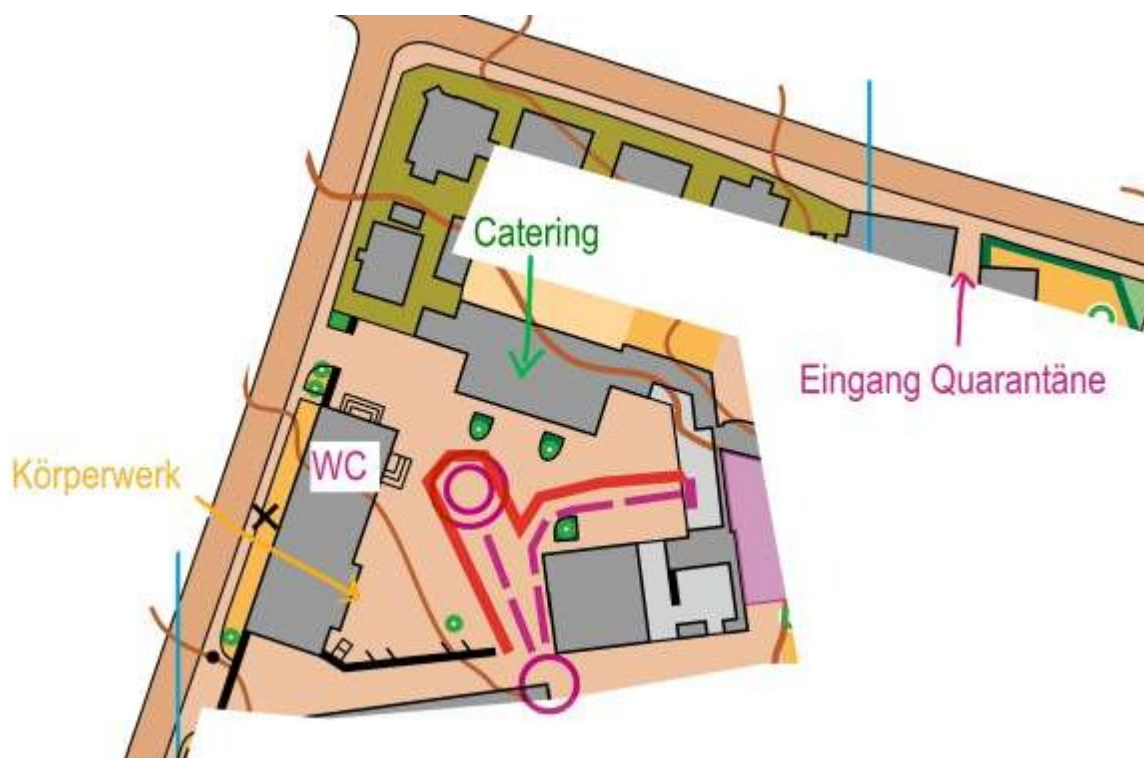

Park and courtyard grounds with castle and stud farm buildings, as well as sections of urban terrain.
The Highway Code applies.

Competition area overview:



Everything outside the sketch is competition area and must not be entered until after the start of the K.O. Sprint quarantine.

Toilets/washing facilities:

Toilets are available.



Notes:

- Dobb spikes are not permitted.
- The Highway Code applies; please be mindful of cars and other road users.
- Please be fair and follow the rules.
- Maps must be handed in at the finish.
- There are artificial barriers.
- Bring your own food into the quarantine area.
- There is a map flip.

Procedure:

The heat selection will take place on Saturday at around 5.15 pm at the WKZ. **Anyone wishing to run the K.O. Sprint must be present in person at the selection.** If they are not present, their place will be given to the next person who would have qualified in their place and who is present at the heat selection.

You must check into the quarantine area between 3.30 pm and 4.00 pm, at which point everyone will be given a back-up SIAC, which must be worn on the same side of the body as your own chip. Before the start of each heat, please take your luggage to the area near the quarantine entrance (this will be clearly marked on site). The roll call and clearance will take place 6 minutes before the start. The GPS will be distributed 5 minutes beforehand, and 3 minutes before the start, you will be led to the start line after the check. There will always be two people at each start post, and the maps may only be taken from the post at the moment of the start.

Following the route marked on the overview map, there is still a short distance to the start triangle in both the semi-finals and the final. The direction to the start triangle will be indicated by marshals. As the semi-finals start at 10-minute intervals, in the event that not all runners in the semi-final currently underway have reached the finish, scouts will intervene in the management of the finish line and the start course after 9 minutes.

At the finish, competitors' own chips are scanned, and the back-up chip is only used if a control point is missing. In addition, all maps and GPS trackers are collected. From those who have not made it to the final, the GPS vests and back-up chips are also collected. A volunteer then takes everyone back to the quarantine area, where the finalists proceed to the finish line quarantine and the others can collect their bags. The finish line quarantine is separate from the start quarantine. To ensure a fair competition, it is forbidden to communicate across the quarantine boundary.

Technical information regarding the German Sprint Relay Championships on 25 May 2026

Terrain description:

A medieval-style half-timbered town with irregular streets and alleys and few parking spaces or open areas. Very flat in the north-western section; the terrain rises noticeably in the south-eastern section. The Highway Code applies.

Competition area overview:



Everything outside the sketch is the competition area and must not be entered until after the sprint relay. The exception is the designated path from the car park, which may be used until 10.00 am.

Toilets/washing facilities:

In addition to two portable toilets, toilets are available in the youth room. There are no washing facilities. Please leave the toilets clean.



Notes:

- Everyone must be **in the competition centre by 10.00 am (finish quarantine)**!
- Dobb spikes are not permitted.
- The Highway Code applies; please watch out for cars and other road users.
- Please be fair and follow the rules.
- Maps must be handed in at the finish. **Please note: Map pouches must not be taken when collecting the maps.**
- There are artificial barriers.
- **There are secular and religious buildings which you may and must enter or pass through.**

Procedure:

The mass start takes place east of the local history museum in two waves.

Wave 1: D/H Elite T, D/H -135 T, D/H -12 T

Wave 2: M/W -16 T, M/W -180 T, Open T

Runners will line up in rows of 10 according to their start numbers. Please follow the instructions of the start team. Maps for the first runners will be handed out based on their start numbers in the starting line-up. The map must remain rolled up after collection. The cardboard tube around the map may only be removed once the start signal has been given. Each runner is responsible for checking that they have received the correct card.

Check that the map matches your start number!

For the sake of clarity, the mandatory route to the start triangle is not shown on the map.

There is a checkpoint approximately two-thirds of the way along the respective course. Depending on the category, the final lap takes approximately 4–8 minutes.

Upon entering the transition zone (dark blue line), the SI chip must be cleared and checked.

The maps, together with a cardboard roll, will be handed out by the organiser in the warm-up area of the transition zone (yellow square). Each runner is responsible for ensuring they receive the correct map.

Check that the map matches your race number!

The cardboard tube must not be removed from the map until after the transition!

You must cross the finish line once within the transition zone. Please watch out for incoming runners there! You are not permitted to go back once you have crossed the line!

Only when the preceding runner enters the finish line may the next runner step up to the transition position (light blue line). Before that, you must remain in the small area to the north, above the northern orange arrow, and only when the preceding runner arrives may you step through the opening indicated by the orange arrow. Please stick to these rules and leave enough space for everyone!

After the changeover, the cardboard tube may be removed and the map opened. For the sake of clarity, the route from the changeover point to the start is not marked on the map. After the changeover, the lead runner runs to the finish.

The map must be handed in after the run.

A changeover without physical contact or unrolling the map too early will result in disqualification. When the final runners cross the finish line, the order in which they cross the line determines the placings.

Important:

The route from the mass start and from the changeover to the start of the orienteering section is not shown on the map for the sake of clarity!
